The Jerusalem Fund

The Jerusalem Fund for Education and Community Development

The Jerusalem Fund for Education and Community Development was established in 1977 as an independent, registered 501(c)(3) nonprofit. It aims to foster greater awareness about Palestine, in the United States and abroad, and to ameliorate the lives of Palestinians in Palestine and the diaspora. The Fund accomplishes these goals through three programs: the Palestine Center, the Humanitarian Link, and Gallery Al-Quds, a film series, and musical and literary offerings.

The Palestine Center

The Palestine Center (formerly the Center for Policy Analysis on Palestine) is the educational program of The Jerusalem Fund and was established in 1991 with the goal of educating Americans about Palestine and the Palestinians, particularly those living in the occupied Palestinian territory (oPt) and surrounding refugee camps in the region. The Palestine Center provides a forum for a Palestinian narrative and perspective on the political, social, and economic issues faced by the Palestinian people including Israeli apartheid and settler-colonialism, media coverage of Israel and Palestine, the right of return, Jerusalem, and U.S. foreign policy in Palestine and the region. Humanitarian Link

The Humanitarian Link is our community development and humanitarian program, established in 1979. The program has extended grants to hospitals, orphanages, clinics, schools, academic institutions, and civil society organizations in historical Palestine and surrounding refugee camps, to sustain the basic conditions of life in Palestine and to overcome the burdens of Israeli occupation. The program expanded in 2009 to support its special project, the Palestine Diabetes Institute. The Humanitarian Link is composed of two main projects:

- **Grants:** We provide small grants on a quarterly basis for humanitarian assistance and community development to Palestinians in the West Bank, Gaza Strip, Jerusalem, Israel, and to Palestinian refugees in Syria (when possible) and Lebanon. Funding is made possible by donations received from concerned American citizens.

- **The Palestinian Diabetes Institute (PDI):** Established as a non-governmental organization in 2009 and registered with the Palestinian Ministries of Interior and Health that same year. The PDI presently has three branches in the West Bank: Al-Bireh (2009), Nablus (2013), and Al-Khalil (2016). Noncommunicable diseases/NCD (chronic diseases) including diabetes constitute a major challenge to the Palestinian health sector. Diabetes is among the leading causes of death among the population. The disease can be managed with careful medical treatment and follow-up. However, most Palestinians who suffer from diabetes do not have access to affordable treatment and can suffer serious complications such as blindness, kidney failure, and circulation problems that lead to amputations. The problem is further compounded by the unemployment, poverty, and daily stressors brought on by the Israeli occupation that controls all aspects of Palestinian life, including travel restrictions and checkpoints. In 2021 alone, the PDI centers reached over 10,000 individuals, including children and pregnant women. Similar to our grants, funding is made possible by donations received from concerned American citizens.

Gallery Al-Quds

In 1998, The Jerusalem Fund initiated a cultural program designed to build bridges of understanding to Arab and Palestinian culture through the visual arts, literature, dance, music, film, workshops, and other special events. The Gallery is reviving, post-Covid, regular exhibits which showcase the contemporary arts of Arab and Arab-American artists. This important program builds critical bridges of understanding through the arts and communicates the Palestinian story in all of its vibrancy, richness, and splendid cultural heritage. What else we do:

- Hosting authors, poets, and playwrights.
- Film series
- Large-scale and intimate concerts.
- Interactive educational opportunities such as workshops in Dabke, calligraphy, mosaic, and embroidery, among others.
- The Annual Souk and Olive Harvest Celebration. Held in December.

Presenter Biographies



Opening and Closing Remarks

Dr. Subhi Ali is Chairman of the Board. A graduate of Howard University Medical School in Washington, DC, his training in General Surgery was completed at Howard University Hospitals, where he was appointed as Assistant Professor of Surgery prior to relocating to Waverly, Tennessee in 1976, where he serves as Chief of Surgery at Three Rivers Hospital. He is currently the President and Treasurer of Howard University's LaSalle D. Leffall, Jr. Surgical Society Foundation. In Tennessee, he has been active in the Tennessee Medical Association (TMA) since 1980. He served as President of TMA in 2003-04 and chaired the Tennessee Medical Education Fund, at where he currently serves as CEO. In 2004, he was appointed by the Governor to the Tennessee State Board of Medical Examiners, where he served for 15 years and retired as the Chairman in 2019. He is a Fellow of the National Federation of State Medical Boards, where he represents the state of Tennessee. Currently, he serves on the boards of several academic and professional organizations. He served as the National President of the State Guard Association of the United States (SGAUS) from 2000-2001, and President of the SGAUS Foundation and editor of the SGAUS journal and website from 2001-2012. He is a retired Brigadier General of the Tennessee State Guard Medical Corps where he served as the Surgeon General from 1991-2001 after serving as Commander of the surgical detachment of the Tennessee Army National Guard. He also served on the Advisory board of the Center for the Study of Human Dignity and Ethics in Health Care at Aquinas College School of Medical Nursing in Nashville, Tennessee. He was appointed to the first board of directors of the Physicians Foundation that was created by the United States Court of Appeals in 2003, and currently serves as the Treasurer and Chairman of the Finance Committee.



Master of Ceremonies

Eid B. Mustafa is the Vice-Chairman and Treasurer of the Board. He is an honor graduate of Alexandria Medical School. He was trained in general surgery at Howard University in Washington, DC, where he received the Resident of the Year award, and attained plastic surgery training at Brown University in Providence, Rhode Island. Dr. Mustafa is in private practice in Wichita Falls, Texas, where he is chief of plastic surgery at United Regional Health Care System and at Kell West Regional Hospital. He served as President of the Wichita County Medical Society, Vice President of the Texas Rehabilitation Commission Medical Committee, and as Treasurer, Vice President, and President of the National Arab American Medical Association (NAAMA), from which he received the NAAMA outstanding physician award. He is a member of many professional associations including ACS, ASPS, ASAPS, and TMA. Dr. Mustafa has served as director of Physicians for Peace for which he is the founder of its Palestine chapter. He also served as President of the North Central Texas Medical Foundation for many years, and is deeply involved in medical volunteer work, particularly in Palestine. Additional awards he has received include the Americanism award from the Daughters of the American Revolution for his international volunteer work and the President's and Physicians' Diplomat awards by Physicians for Peace. He was recently awarded The International Surgical Volunteerism Award by The American College of Surgeons.

Panel 1: Nakba at 70



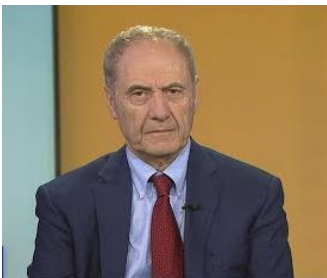
Professor Ilan Pappé is the director of the European Center for Palestine Studies at the University of Exeter. He received his D. Phil from the University of Oxford. Until 2007, Pappé taught at the university of Haifa, Israel from which he was expelled due to his ideological positions. He moved to Exeter where he teaches now at the Institute of Arab and Islamic Studies. Pappé wrote 20 books to date, the most famous of them being *The Ethnic Cleansing of Palestine* and *On Palestine* (jointly with Noam Chomsky). His most recent book is *The Biggest Prison on Earth: A History of the Israeli Occupation*.



Dr Anne Irfan is Lecturer in Interdisciplinary Race, Gender and Postcolonial Studies at University College London. She has published several award-winning articles in outlets including the *Journal of Palestine Studies*, *Journal of Refugee Studies* and *Jerusalem Quarterly*, as well as contributing to *The Washington Post*, *The Nation* and *Al Jazeera*. Anne is the author of [Refuge and Resistance: Palestinians and the International Refugee System](#), out now with Columbia University Press.



Shawan Jabarin has been the General Director of Al-Haq since 2006, the first human rights organization in the Arab region. Jabarin received a BA in Sociology from Birzeit University and an LLM in International Human Rights Law from the National University of Ireland, Galway. He also took part in many graduate and advanced academic programs at Columbia University, USA, and the University of Strasbourg, France. In 1987, Jabarin started his career at Al-Haq as a field researcher, documenting human rights abuses by the Israeli occupying authorities throughout the occupied Palestinian territory. He then shifted to legal research and accepted a leadership position in international advocacy. Jabarin served as a part-time lecturer at Birzeit University, Palestine. Jabarin participated in numerous international conferences on International Criminal Law and Human Rights Law worldwide and received the Distinguished Graduate Award from the Irish Centre for Human Rights in 2010. Mr. Jabarin is a Palestinian national and father of four children.



Dr. Edmund Ghareeb is the Senior Scholar at the Palestine Center. An internationally recognized expert on the Middle East, Kurds, Iraq, and media issues, Dr. Ghareeb was the first Mustafa Barzani Scholar of Global Kurdish Studies at American University. He taught at George Washington University, as well as the University of Virginia, Georgetown University in DC and Qatar, and McGill University.

He is the author of 12 books on topics such as the Gulf War, Kurds, Iraq media, the new media revolution in the Middle East and Arab world, and US media coverage of the Middle East.

He also is a frequent commentator and analyst for numerous outlets including Associated Press, BBC, Al Hurra, Al Jazeera and is regularly interviewed by American, European, Arab, and Asian media outlets.

Panel 2: Oslo at 30



Leila Farsakh is Associate Professor and Chair of political science at the University of Massachusetts Boston. She is the author of “Palestinian Labor Migration to Israel: Labour, Land, and Occupation” and has published on questions related to the political economy of the Israeli-Palestinian conflict.



Ali Abunimah is executive director of The Electronic Intifada, an independent publication focused on Palestine, and is the author of two books, “One Country” and “The Battle for Justice in Palestine.”



Zaha Hassan is a human rights lawyer and a fellow at the Carnegie Endowment for International Peace. Her research focus is on Palestine-Israel peace, the use of international legal mechanisms by political movements, and U.S. foreign policy in the region. Previously, she was the coordinator and senior legal advisor to the Palestinian negotiating team during Palestine’s bid for UN membership and was a member of the Palestinian delegation to Quartet-sponsored exploratory talks between 2011 and 2012. She regularly participates in track II peace efforts and is a contributor to The Hill and Haaretz. Her commentaries have appeared in the New York Times, Salon, Al Jazeera English, CNN, and others. She holds a JD from the University of California, Berkeley, School of Law and an LLM in Transnational and International Law from the Willamette University School of Law.



Said Arikat is a Member of the Palestine Center Committee and the Washington bureau chief for the Palestinian newspaper al-Quds, a daily for which he is a writer, columnist, and analyst. He previously served as spokesman and director of public information for the United Nations Assistance Mission for Iraq and currently teaches as an adjunct professor at American University in Washington, DC.

Panel 3: Analysis and Action



Ayah Ziyadeh is the advocacy director for Americans for Justice in Palestine Action and American Muslims for Palestine. She is a Palestinian-American human rights scholar, advocate, and writer who has a track record in organizing awareness of Palestine and other crucial human rights issues. Ayah has over 7 years of political and grassroots advocacy and lobbying campaign experience. This experience consists of being a legislative staff, a lobbying intern working closely with the ACLU, and an organizer working with several different organizations and coalitions, providing her with extensive knowledge of all the spaces contributing to policy-making and advocacy. Aside from her work, she has completed her master's in International Human Rights at the Josef Korbel School of International Relations. Throughout her graduate experience, she specialized in Palestinian rights, resistance, and the dynamics of the ethnic cleansing of Palestine. She has completed an abundance of research and policy work on the issue.



Josh Ruebner is Director of Government Relations with the Institute for Middle East Understanding, and an Adjunct Lecturer in Justice and Peace Studies at Georgetown University. He is currently finishing his PhD at the University of Exeter's European Centre for Palestine Studies where his dissertation is entitled "A Tragedy of Catastrophic Proportions: The US and the Palestinian Nakba, 1947-1950". Ruebner is author of *Shattered Hopes: Obama's Failure to Broker Israeli-Palestinian Peace* and *Israel: Democracy or Apartheid State?* He is a former Analyst in Middle East Affairs at Congressional Research Service. Ruebner holds an MA in International Relations from Johns Hopkins School of Advanced International Studies and a BA in Political Science and Near East Studies from the University of Michigan.



Hassan El-Tayyab is an author, songwriter, and legislative director for Middle East policy and advocacy organizer at Friends Committee on National Legislation. Hassan leads FCNL's work to end U.S. military involvement in the Saudi-led war on Yemen, advocate for Palestinian human rights, and advance diplomacy with Iran. Hassan was honored by Arab America Foundation as an awardee of its 2022 "40 under 40" initiative, for his policy work on Capitol Hill. Prior to joining FCNL, Hassan served as the co-director of the national advocacy group Just Foreign Policy, where he worked to reassert Congressional war authority and promote human rights in the Middle East and Latin America. He is frequently invited to guest lecture at colleges and universities around the United States on foreign affairs. His writings and commentaries have been featured in numerous national and international news outlets, including CNN, BBC World News, Politico, the Intercept, and more.



Jihad Abusalim is the Executive Director of The Jerusalem Fund. He is a PhD Candidate in the History and Hebrew and Judaic Studies joint program at New York University. His main area of research is Palestinian and Arab perceptions of the Zionist project and the Jewish question before 1948. He earned his bachelor's degree in business administration and Hebrew language and teaching methods from Al-Azhar University in Gaza, Palestine. An accomplished speaker and writer, Jihad combines his passion for history with his commitment to activism and policy change work. Jihad recently edited the book *Light in Gaza: Writings Born of Fire* published by Haymarket Books in 2022. He has been published in Al-Jazeera, the Washington Post, Journal of Palestine Studies, the New Arab, Middle East Eye, and Vox, and contributed to the anthology *Gaza as Metaphor* with a chapter entitled "From Fence to Fence: Retelling Gaza's Story."
